



Kitten Vaccination Schedule

A new kitten is an exciting addition to your family. The kitten's health is both your and our responsibility. Below is a schedule of vaccinations and other services that we recommend:

6-8 weeks Physical Examination

- Distemper, Herpesvirus, Calicivirus, and Chlamydia vaccines
- Deworming
- Feline Leukemia and FIV Testing - *very important*
- Free Sample of Eukanuba Food
- Begin Frontline or Advantage flea preventative

9-11 weeks Physical Examination

- Distemper, Herpesvirus, Calicivirus, and Chlamydia vaccines
- 1st Feline Leukemia vaccine
- 1st Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Vaccine (recommended)
- Deworming

12-15 weeks Physical Examination

- Distemper, Herpesvirus, Calicivirus, and Chlamydia vaccines
- 2nd Feline Leukemia vaccine
- 2nd Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Vaccine (recommended)
- Start Heartworm Preventative
- Rabies vaccine
- Deworming

15-18 weeks 3rd Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Vaccine (if series begun)

Then yearly - Complete Physical Examination, Distemper, Herpesvirus, Calicivirus, Chlamydia, and Leukemia vaccinations

Rabies vaccination - 1st vaccination is good for 1 year, each subsequent vaccination can be good for 3 years

Spay or Neuter at approximately 3-6 months of age

Strategic Deworming every 3 months as needed according to risk (see our handout on Deworming Protocols)

Declaw Surgery can be performed as early as 12 weeks of age [this surgical procedure may be combined with a Neuter procedure (for male cats), but should not be performed at the same time as a Spay (for female cats) procedure

Feline Leukemia Virus and FIV testing as recommended (see our handout on Testing Recommendations)
